- Principal's Report Mr. Orsini
 - Thank you to the BOE Candidates for coming to the meeting and speaking about their platforms.
 - Mr. Wu 6th Graders went on their 6th Grade Camp Field Trip in Hewitt, NJ. Franklin Students went today and Ridge will go tomorrow. 5 School Buses so each student has their own seat. Masks and hand sanitizer were used and each student brought their own lunch. Activities focus on team building and kindness. Three Ridgewood Police Officers joined and connected with the students throughout various activities. Very successful and the students loved it!

 - Preliminary data is back from the Start Strong Testing. On average, there has not been learning loss; rather learning has been maintained; however, there are groups of kids who have experienced loss of learning and the Guidance Counselors are working with the Teacher Teams to match the testing data to the current performance in the classroom. Seeing some behavioral issues (i.e., lack of self awareness, interrupting in the classroom,etc.) Teachers are working to address behavior issues in a positive way.

 - Mark Kossick, Kohort Technologies, Inc., discussed GroupSpot and the online directory. Currently we have just over 400 members. Mark gave a quick demonstration and walked through how to navigate the GroupSpot App, how to navigate the online directory as well as the online calendar which you are able to sync with an external calendar on your device.
